Jesus the Redeemer

Revelation 5:9-10

Redemption is being bought back. It is to be delivered out of enemy hands by ransom and set free. As sinners, we all sold ourselves into slavery for _____ (Isaiah 52:3), but Jesus is the Redeemer who liberates us from our bondage.

the Redeemer's PITY

Isaiah 63:9 reveals the motive of God in our redemption: His love for us and the mercy that He had on our afflicted condition. In fact, it says that He Himself was afflicted by our affliction! When Jesus stopped Saul from hunting down, locking up, and killing Christians, He confronted him with the question "Why persecutest thou _____?" (*Acts 9:4*) How comforting to know that Jesus takes my pain _____!

the Redeemer's POWER

Redemption implies power_____ness on the part of the captive. Jeremiah 31:11 points out this principle and reminds us that God's power is greater than whatever has us bound! *Matthew 12:22-29* shows us that Jesus is mighty enough to take captive our captor and reclaim us for Himself.

the Redeemer's PAYMENT

The price of our redemption was the blood of the slain Savior.
